## Our Vision:

PCSI is recognized as the innovative Community Action leader in reducing the impact of poverty in Pittsburgh through direct service, advocacy, mobilization of resources, sustainable economic empowerment, and effective institutional change.

## What's a Community Action Agency?

Community Action Agencies (CAAs) are nonprofit private and public organizations. The CAA designation was established under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 to fight America's War on Poverty.

Today there are approximately 1000 Community Action Agencies serving low-income people in every state, as well as Puerto Rico and the Trust Territories. The goal of CAAs is to empower low-income people and families to achieve self-sufficiency, reducing the impact of poverty.
